

IRS is Coming for All the Bad ERC Claims

The very first time the IRS started warning people about ERC compliance and the scams and schemes going on was in the fall of 2022 after a big push from the AICPA. Lets take a look at how this has been going in just the past 12 months and see how it's escalated dramatically from the first warning in October 2022.

IRS is supposed to be working on a voluntary disclosure type of program to repay bad ERC claims that have been received. More to come fall 2023.

IRS is supposed to be working on a way for taxpayers to pull back their unprocessed ERC claims if they now believe it to be a bad claim. More to come fall 2023.

IRS says claims already received prior to the moratorium will see increased processing times, 180 days or longer. In my experience the time to process was already a few months longer than the IRS claimed, so when they say 6+ months I would view that as more like 9+ months for those already submitted claims.

IRS is not processing new claims at all for the next 3.5 months, after that we should expect increased professing time, it could easily be 9-12-15 months to get ERC claims processed now.
